

Undeclared, misdeclared and other non-compliant dangerous goods – National Cargo Bureau's approach to the problem

In July 2020, the National Cargo Bureau (NCB) published a [white paper](#) advocating for a comprehensive approach to address the challenging issue of misdeclared and undeclared dangerous goods. The document outlines the significant risks to which crews, ships, cargoes and the environment are exposed to when dangerous goods (DG) are not shipped in compliance with the necessary rules and regulations. The continuous growth of the size of container ships which are carrying ever more containers represents a further increase of accumulation risk. This issue has long been a serious concern for marine insurers and IUMI therefore strongly supports the recommendations set out in the NCB paper.
