Vessel Traffic Services (VTS)

- IMO Resolution A.857 (20)
 - a service implemented by a competent authority, designed to improve the safety and efficiency of vessel traffic and to protect the environment.
 - the service should have the capability to interact with the traffic and to respond to traffic situations developing in the VTS area.

- Information Service
- Traffic Organization Service
- Navigational Assistance Service



International Standards

- Standardization : services, procedures, communication, nomenclature
- Professionalism : training, certification, accreditation, QMS
- Continuous Development : IALA VTS Committee

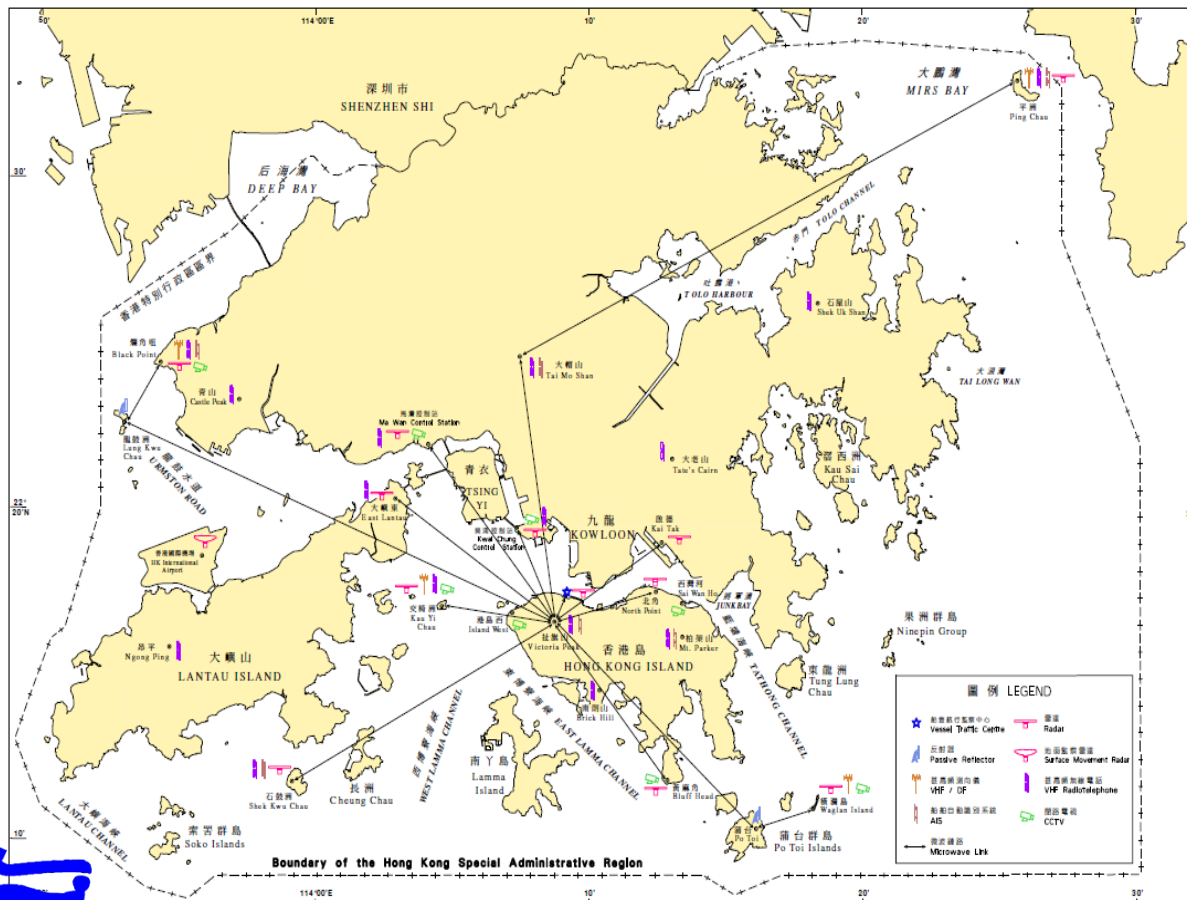

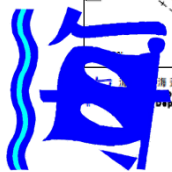
Hong Kong VTS

Hong Kong VTS

- Infrastructure
 - Sensors (Radar, AIS, CCTV, VHF-DF), VTS system, VHF, VTS-IS, PPS.
- Services
 - INS, TOS and NAS
 - emergency response
 - development (TSS, Fairway, navigation aids)
 - Regional co-operation (SZMSA, GDMSA, China MSA)



VTC and MRCC

- emergency response : VTC
 - handle problems to protect life, port safety, environment and properties
 - co-operation/monitor/facilitate salvage
- search and rescue : MRCC
 - search and rescue life in peril
 - not salvage



Relationship with Insurance Industry

- contribute to risk reduction
- facilitate salvage
- maintain traffic records of marine incidents
